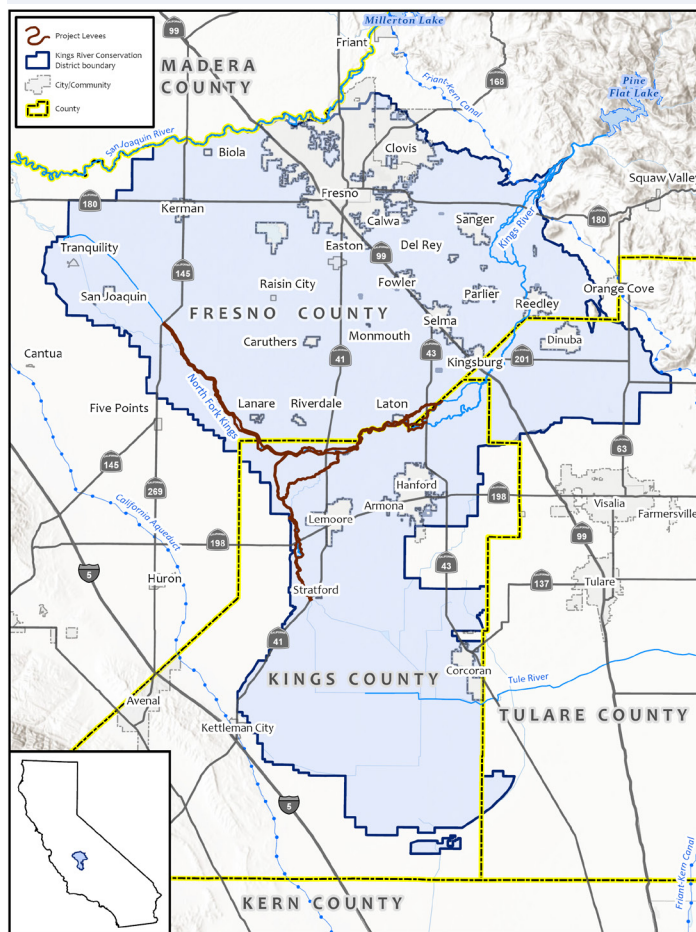

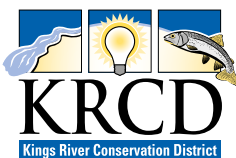

The Kings River Conservation District operates 140 miles of federal levees along the Kings River, beginning upstream of Highway 43, including the North Fork of the Kings River, the Clark's Fork, South Fork, and Crescent Bypass; ending at the James Bypass in the North Fork, and near Stratford in the South Fork. This guide is for the KRCD service area, which includes portions of Fresno, Kings and Tulare Counties.



The Kings River Conservation District is a special purpose public agency created by local voters in 1951. KRCD's primary responsibilities are flood control, hydro power, and water resources stewardship.
